FSOS 2020 Annual Fluke Tournament Official Rules*

1. Maximum of two (2) fluke weighed per boat.

2. Prize money based on full entry. A percentage of prize money awarded if not filled.

3. One day tournament rain or shine

4. Weigh-in will be at the following location:

Belmar Marina (Shark River Inlet) 732-681-2266

Hoffman's Marina (Manasquan inlet) 732-528-6935

Kelly's Landing Marina (1418 Renwick Pl. Long Branch, N.J) 732-544-1243

5. Boats can start fishing @ 5:30 AM.

6. ALL BOATS MUST BE AT A WEIGH STATION NO LATER THAN 2:30 PM

NO EXCEPTIONS. Stations open at 12:00 PM.

7. Weigh-in slips will be issued at the Captain's Meeting, and must be filled out by the Captain or crew member with Boat # and name.

8. Fish must be caught on rod & reel, IGFA Rules, Rules of NJ Fish, Game and Wildlife shall prevail.

9. Tournament Committee members reserve the right to inspect and examine all fish. All Tournament Committee decisions are final.

- 10. Any tampering of fish weight will result in disqualification (*and/or will be prosecuted to the fullest extent of the law.*)
- 11. All persons on boat MUST BE REGISTERED. No Exception.

12. All entrants will fish at their own risk. FSOS assumes no responsibility or liability for any captain's decisions or for any boat in this tournament.

13. At least one representative must attend the Captain's Meeting on Friday, August 7, 2020 at 6:30 PM. to receive tournament package.

14. Positively no transferring of fish between boats.

15. In case of a tie, the first fish weighed in will take position.

16. It is the responsibility of the shillelagh member to notify weigh-in officials that they are a member in good standing and show valid ID card and indicate same on weigh in slip.

(Shillelagh members weighing in a fish should initial weigh in slip.) 17. ALL FISH MUST BE WEIGHED IN, BY BOAT NO EXCEPTIONS

NOTE: A member must be in good standings in order to receive bonus pay out. NO exceptions.

Irish History #73 Two Mutinies and Two Executions 100 Years Ago

Two mutinies - 6,000 miles apart - took place in June 1920. Both were related to the presence of British soldiers in Ireland. The Connaught Ranger mutiny happened in Punjab, India. The Listowel Mutiny occurred in Listowel, Co. Kerry.

The Connaught Rangers were one of 8 Irish regiments (north and south) in the British Army. The Rangers home base was Galway. During World War I (WWI), they fought at Gallipoli in the 10th Irish Division, and at the Somme in the 16th Irish Division where they suffered heavy losses. The Rangers were stationed in India during the original "Troubles" - the Irish War of Independence - to minimize divided loyalties among Irish soldiers in the British Army. Nonetheless, some of the soldiers could not escape from the divided loyalties they held.

A Connaught Ranger attended a hurling match while home on leave in Co. Clare. He was dismayed by the presence of "Crown Forces" with fixed bayonets at the game. Upon returning to his unit in the Punjab, he discussed his observations at the match and the need to do something about it. He and three other Rangers engaged in a peaceful protest by taking over a guardroom. The next day 250 more Rangers joined-in by laying down their arms, wearing rosettes that were the color of the Irish flag and singing Irish nationalist songs.

The protest was aimed at British policy in Ireland and the actions of the Black and Tans. The Black and Tans were veterans of WWI. They were recruited to serve as police "constables" in Ireland to support the Royal Irish Constabulary (RIC), who were unable to control the IRA insurgency. Their name - Black and Tans - derived from the khaki trousers and black jackets they wore. The clothing, although not a uniform, was distinctive and the name caught-on.

Policemen they weren't. The Black and Tans where more like an undisciplined and thuggish paramilitary militia.

Noted for assassinating republicans, burning homes and businesses, and conducting reprisals, the Black and Tans quickly gained a reputation among the Irish people for being vengeful and murderous. What they wrought on Ireland was a "reign of terror." British Secretary of War Winston Churchill's decision to restore law and order by sending the Black and Tans to reinforce the RIC was a miserable failure. It backfired by causing increased disorder. And their brutish conduct was directly tied to an increase in support for the IRA and independence. To spread the protest, two Ranger mutineers went to another military base with a Ranger detachment. After arrest, they were returned to the original base and placed in the guardhouse. At the second base, however, a protest took root. As part of a "passive resistance," protesters handed their weapons over to British officers. After a change of heart, 30 Rangers in C Company attempted to seize the rifles from the armory. The protest was no longer peaceful. Two of the rioters were shot and killed. British troops from other garrisons were called-in to quell the disturbances at both locations.

88 Rangers were charged with mutiny and courtmartialed. Ten were acquitted; the rest were convicted and imprisoned. 14 of those convicted were sentenced to death. Private James Daly, from Co. Westmeath, was spokesman for the protesters in C Company. He received a death sentence, which was carried-out before year's end when he was shot by firing-squad. He was the last member of the British armed forces to be executed for mutiny. His body was exhumed in India and returned home in 1970. Sentences for the others on death row were commuted. All prisoners were released from jail after Ireland gained independence. When they returned to their native land, they were shunned by those sympathetic to the IRA for joining the British Army and by former soldiers for being "turncoats."

That same month, back in Ireland, there was another mutiny related to the presence of British security forces. We've read about Lieutenant Colonel (LTC) Gerald Smyth on these pages before (Chapter 67). Shortly after his appointment as Divisional Police Commissioner for Munster, he addressed members of the RIC in Listowel. According Irish Central News, he told them:

"Sinn Fein have had all the sport up to the present, but we are going to have the sport now. The police are not in sufficient strength to do anything but hold their barracks. This is not enough for as long as we remain on the defensive, so long will Sinn Fein have the whip hand. We must take the offensive ... I am promised as many troops from England as I require, thousands are coming daily.

Third, if a police barracks is burned or if the barracks already occupied is not suitable, then the best house in the locality is to be commandeered, the occupants thrown in the gutter. Let them die there - the more the merrier.

. . .

Fourth, police and military will patrol the country at least five nights a week. They are not to confine themselves to main roads, but to make across the country, lie in ambush and when civilians are seen approaching shout 'Hands-up."

Fifth, would the order 'Hands-up' not be immediately obeyed, shoot and shoot with effect. If the person approaching a patrol carry their hands in their pocket, or are in any was suspicious looking shoot them down. You may make mistakes occasionally and innocent persons may be shot, but that cannot be helped, and you are bound to get the right parties some time. The more you shoot, the better I will like you, and I assure you no policeman will get into trouble shooting any man.

General Tudor and myself, want your assistance in carrying out this scheme and wiping out Sinn Fein. Any man who is prepared to be a hindrance rather than a help to us, had better leave the job at once."

There are many problems with this talk. It blurs the line between military action and police work. It calls for unjustified reprisals, elevating them to the level of official government policy. It encourages unlawful extra-judicial killings, by saying they will be viewed as good and go unpunished.

RIC Constable Jeremiah Mee, from Co. Sligo, took LTC Smyth up on his admonition for the law-abiding to leave the job. Irish Central News reported that Mee stepped forward and told Smyth: "By your accent I take it you are an Englishman and, in your ignorance, forget that you are addressing Irishmen." Then Mee placed his gun, cap, belt and bayonet on a table, saying "these too are English, take them as a present from me and to hell with you, you are a murderer." Smyth ordered Mee arrested, but the others ignored his order. 13 Constables joined Mee in tendering resignations.

Michael Collins learned about Smyth's words from one of the RIC men who was present. Smyth became a marked man, and six IRA men shot him to death in Cork a month later. Before killing him, the IRA team leader said: "Colonel, were not your orders to shoot on sight? Well, you are in sight now, so prepare." Smyth's body was returned to Northern Ireland for his funeral and burial in Banbridge, Co. Down.

The matter known as "Listowel Mutiny" ended in a reckoning for Smyth and the Black and Tans. Collins saw to it that they paid-off a debt in blood. Slan, EMN
