Irish History #85

Peace Talks Commence

In the last two chapters, we considered the back and forth between Irish Prime Minister Eamon de Valera and British Prime Minister David Lloyd George on what each leader viewed as the reason for holding peace talks. For de Valera, it was about fulfilling Irish national aspirations and achieving self-determination. For Lloyd George, it was about allegiance to the throne and Dominion status for Ireland.

Unfortunately, during this to-and-fro, the status of Ireland's six northeast counties - Ulster - was not given the attention it deserved. The leaders focused on their own concept of sovereignty, without specifically describing how Ulster fit into that.

After the truce was declared in July 1921, the leaders exchanged letters about a peace conference for two months. On September 12, de Valera sent two emissaries to Scotland, where Lloyd George was vacationing, to press his points. This was to no avail, however, as Lloyd George cancelled the preliminary arrangements for a conference after meeting the emissaries. The prospect of renewed conflict was real, and it caused de Valera to backpedal.

While not conceding his position, de Valera responded to the cancellation by advising Lloyd George that a conference should be held without "any condition precedent." That is, neither side should be required to abandon their position before it began.

In an unprecedented move, the British Cabinet met with Lloyd George in Scotland. It was the first time the Cabinet ever met somewhere other than at 10 Downing Street in London. The stakes were high. The British government had to decide whether to return to war or to try for a peace settlement. With Cabinet support, on September 29 Lloyd George issued de Valera a "fresh invitation" for peace talks.

This invitation set forth the basis for the negotiations: "to meet your delegates as spokesman of the people whom you represent with a view to ascertaining

how the association of Ireland with the community of nations known as the British Empire may best be reconciled with Irish national aspirations." (Emphasis added). De Valera accepted the invitation the next day.

The invitation made clear that de Valera would not be speaking for Ulster because he did not represent that part of Ireland. And no representative of Northern Ireland Prime Minister James Craig's government took part in the talks. Thus, Ulster's reunification with southern Ireland was not treated as a critical issue. History has shown this oversight had tragic consequences.

Except for Michael Collins, the Irish team arrived in London by boat and train on Saturday, October 8. Collins arrived the next day. He was greeted by British Sunday newspaper articles that labelled him a "murderer." Afterall, less than a year earlier, Lloyd George had called Collins and the IRA a "murder gang." Now, however, some of the highest-ranking members in the UK government were going to negotiate with an Irish delegation that included Collins.

Peace talks commenced at 10 Downing Street on October 11. Lloyd George greeted each member of the Irish delegation by shaking their hands at the door. He led them to one side of a table and introduced them to the formidable British delegation seated at the table's other side. Led by Lloyd George, the British negotiating team included Hamar Greenwood (Chief Secretary for Ireland), Tom Jones and Lionel Curtis (recording secretaries), Austen Chamberlain (Conservative Party leader in the House of Commons), F.E. Smith (Lord Chancellor), Winston Churchill (then Secretary of State for the Colonies, later UK Prime Minister), Gordon Hewart (Attorney General), and L. Worthington Evans (Secretary of State for War).

Arthur Griffith, Irish Minister for Foreign Affairs, was Chairman of the Irish team selected by de Valera.

With him were Erskine Childers and John Chartres (recording secretaries), E.J. Dugan (attorney), Robert Barton (Irish Minister for Economic Affairs), G. Gavan Duffy (attorney), and Collins (Irish Minister for Finance and head of the Irish Republican Brotherhood). There was no comparison between the teams in terms of political deal-making expertise.

The negotiating experience of any one of the British "Big Four" - Lloyd George, Chamberlain, Smith and Churchill - was much deeper than the experience of the entire Irish delegation combined. Yet the British team had to tread carefully in the talks. Lloyd George's coalition government depended upon Conservative support to remain in power. Their goal was to balance achievement of a genuine peace deal without permitting Ireland to "secede" from the British Empire. This was a tricky mission, because de Valera's expectations were still unclear. For de Valera, obfuscation was a character trait.

Griffith and Collins exhibited skills that surprised the British, who learned these men were "extremely quick and shrewd in a deal." Collins in particular was impressive. When sub-committees were set-up for "financial relations, naval and air defense, and observation of the Truce," Collins joined them all and rapidly mastered technical details. In plenary sessions, Griffith took the lead in challenging Lloyd George. During the talks, the British came to view both Griffith and Collins as "courageous" for the positions they espoused.

The Irish delegation was hindered by more than its lack of experience. After de Valera's maneuverings (See Chapter 84), the Irish team was not as unified about what it sought in a peace deal as the British. The Irish also had to report back to de Valera in Dublin regularly for instructions, while Lloyd George was leading from the front. He directed the negotiating "strategy and tactics" for the British delegation.

Under a British proposal, a record of the conference was made by long-hand written note takers, not a stenographer. Hence, each side had recording secretaries. Lloyd George opened the first plenary session on October 11 by advising the Irish of the

"limitations" on what the British could agree to. And he warned them that, if those limits could not be met, "the responsibility for failure [rested] . . . with others," meaning the Irish. Griffith responded with a cutting rejoinder. He said: "England's policy in the past has been to treat Ireland as a conquered and subject country. If there is a change of policy of subordinating Ireland to English interests, then there appears to be a possibility of peace."

Lloyd George attempted to set the stage for a discussion of Dominion status at the outset of the talks. Griffith, however, shrewdly raised issues related to coastal defense and trade. Discussion of these issues took-up the rest of the first plenary session.

The second plenary session was held that evening. Griffith raised the question of finances and liability for the costs of the war. Lloyd George proposed the formation of a subcommittee on the issue. This was accepted and Collins became a member of the subcommittee. The talks then adjourned for two days.

In assessing the first day's events, Griffith had "the impression that the English government is anxious for peace." He also came with away with a sense that "Lloyd George is a remarkably suave and astute man." The Irish delegation would learn just how astute and treacherous Lloyd George was by the end of the negotiations.

At this early stage, however, both sides withheld disclosing their positions on key matters, like Dominion status. That fight would come later. Five more plenary sessions were held during October; and subcommittee meetings were held throughout the talks that lasted two months. This crucial timeframe in Irish history will be explored in future chapters.
