# Irish History # 68 - Bloody Sunday Update

You will recall reading about Bloody Sunday on these pages before. It is time to do so again. January 30th was the 48th anniversary of Bloody Sunday, and fallout from that infamous day continues to reverberate. A recap of what happened on the streets of Derry will be presented first; then three current, ongoing matters related to Bloody Sunday will be considered.

The day's tragic events started as a civil rights protest against internment. Internment – detention without trial - was imposed by Northern Ireland Prime Minister Brian Faulkner five months earlier. The minority community held many nonviolent protests against internment. Nobel Peace Prize recipient John Hume led a march against internment two weeks before Bloody Sunday. January 30th was a mass protest, as tens of thousands attended the civil rights march. Copying a tactic used by southern officials during the U.S. civil rights movement, the Stormont government banned the march.

Two and one-half years earlier, after RUC ineptitude worsened riots in Derry and Belfast (Lord Justice Scarman, Report on Violence and Civil Disturbances in Northern Ireland in 1969), British military forces were sent to Northern Ireland to keep the peace. On Bloody Sunday, Faulkner urged the military “to take a hard line” against peaceful protesters.

The march was orderly as it headed toward Free Derry Corner. Some protesters, however, moved toward an army barricade. They were repelled by water cannons and rubber bullets. Additionally, youth threw stones at the army. Like past marches, chaos descended on the event. For the first time, however, members of the British Army's First Parachute Regiment (1 PARA) fired rifles indiscriminately into the crowd. Thousands ran for cover as shots rang out. One-half hour later, 13 unarmed civilians lay dead; a 14th died from his wounds; and 17 were injured. The dead and injured fell in many areas of the Bogside. All were shot by soldiers.

Fallout was dramatic and widespread. Mobs in Dublin burned-down the British Embassy. The civil rights movement was over. Ivan Cooper, one of the march's organizers, said “Bloody Sunday destroyed the civil rights movement and opened up a path for the hard men” of the IRA. The minority community was totally alienated, and even moderates withdrew their support for the government.

British Prime Minister Edward Heath suspended Stormont and imposed direct rule on Northern Ireland from London. The IRA saw this as a victory; the end of Stormont was a step toward unification of the island. Sadly, Bloody Sunday ushered in the deadliest year of the Troubles - 497 died.

The British government established a tribunal headed by Lord Chief Justice Widgery to investigate what happened. The Widgery Report, completed a few months later, unconditionally exonerated the soldiers and blamed the deaths on the march's organizers. The report also said “there is no reason to suppose that soldiers would have opened fire if they had not been fired upon first.” It took 38 years for the truth to replace the unfounded suppositions.

In 1997, British Prime Minister Tony Blair called for a new review of Bloody Sunday and established the Lord Saville Inquiry. Twelve years later, the Saville Report provided findings debunking Widgery's conclusions as baseless.

The Saville report declared the innocence of the victims and the guilt of the soldiers. The report concluded that “soldiers of 1 PARA on Bloody Sunday caused the deaths of 13 people and injury to a similar number, none of whom was posing a threat of causing death or serious bodily injury.” The report said soldiers did not act in self-defense or warn civilians of their intention to shoot; and, even worse, they lied to cover-up their acts.

David Cameron was British Prime Minister when the Saville Report was released. He acknowledged the findings in the House of Commons and called them “absolutely clear.” He said, “There is no doubt, there is nothing equivocal, there are no ambiguities. What happened on Bloody Sunday was both unjustified and unjustifiable. It was wrong.”

Cameron apologized to family members of those killed: “What happened should never have happened. The families of those who died should not have to live with the pain and hurt of that day, and a lifetime of loss. Some members of the Armed Forces acted wrongly. The government is ultimately responsible for the Armed Forces. And for that, on behalf of the government - and indeed our country - I am deeply sorry.”

After nearly four decades, family members of those killed finally saw responsibility and blame for the atrocity placed where it belonged - on members of 1 PARA. Family members felt “vindicated,” but still had one more goal to achieve for loved ones. They wanted those responsible prosecuted. In 2015, the Police Service of Northern Ireland (PSNI) opened an investigation involving members of the First Parachute Regiment. The PSNI file on Bloody Sunday was referred to the Public Prosecution Service (PPS). The PPS assessed the conduct of 16 paratroopers.

The PPS decision on whether to prosecute was announced late last year. The PPS determined that evidence against one soldier, described as Soldier F, met the “test for prosecution.” That is, two criteria were satisfied: first, there

was a reasonable prospect for conviction based upon the evidence; and second, the prosecution was in the public interest. Soldier F was charged with murder (2) and attempted murder (4) of six Bloody Sunday victims. A fifth attempted murder charge was added later. The PPS also decided that the available evidence was “insufficient to provide a reasonable prospect of conviction” of other soldiers.

This month, a judge announced he will render a decision on venue in a few weeks. Soldier F’s trial will be held in either Belfast or Derry.

Aside from this prosecution, families of the victims brought civil actions against the Ministry of Defense (MOD). Damages in the amount of three million pounds have been awarded.

On Bloody Sunday, Bernie McGuigan went to the aid of Patrick Doherty, who was shot and later died. Although waiving a handkerchief, McGuigan was shot in the head and killed instantly. His estate settled its claim against the MOD for 258,000 pounds. A High Court judge awarded an additional 15,000 pounds as “aggravated damages,” finding the soldier’s actions in shooting McGuigan would have “filled the deceased with fear and dread coupled with a strong sense of indignation and hurt at being an innocent victim of a blatant, unprovoked and unjust attack by members of the Army.”

The MOD challenged the award of aggravated damages. This month, the Belfast Court of Appeal dismissed the MOD challenge. The full award stands.

British Prime Minister (PM) Boris Johnson won a resounding election victory in parliamentary elections held in December. He pledged “to end the repeated and vexatious pursuit of veterans” over offenses committed in the line of duty. Johnson established a new Office of

Veterans Affairs to accomplish this. One target is said to be cases against soldiers over historical allegations of illegal conduct arising in Northern Ireland.

At present, in addition to Soldier F, five other soldiers are being prosecuted for killings that occurred during the Troubles. The government says “[t]he PM has been clear that we need to end the unfair trials of people who served their country when no new evidence has been produced and when the accusations have already been exhaustively questioned in court.” New legislation to create a statutory presumption against prosecution of military personnel for conduct committed in the course of their duty over ten years ago is under discussion.

It is unclear how a law of this nature would impact the ongoing prosecutions. What is clear is that in Great Britain the debate over what to do about Bloody Sunday remains intense nearly 50 years later. It is equally clear that in Northern Ireland Bloody Sunday still casts a large shadow over the community. What happened raises fundamental questions related to how to ensure government accountability, deal with the legacy of Northern Ireland’s bloody past, and achieve reconciliation and healing in a divided society.

When the Saville Report was released back in 2009, family members of the Bloody Sunday victims marched from Free Derry Corner to Guild Hall Square in Derry, where the report was made public. After reading the report’s conclusions, they sang “We Shall Overcome.” A line from that civil rights anthem goes: “Deep in my heart, I do believe, we shall overcome one day.” They believed while others did not. They have kept the faith. So should we. Without faith in the rule of law, those fundamental questions won’t be answered. (by EMN)

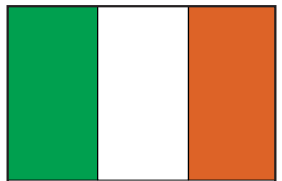
